

AKA - The Always Done Quilt!

Every week = one block = one completely finished quilt-let = Always Done!



- Bring needle through the crease of the fabric.
- Hide Knot inside crease of the seam allowance.
- Take a stitch (about 1/8") inside the very edge of the crease.
- Enter into the very edge of the crease directly across.
- Take a stitch inside the very edge of the crease (1/8").
- Pull the stitches snug to bring the fabric edges together.
- Repeat to the end of your seam.
- To add strength to your seams, repeat from the beginning, and stitch the seam a second time in the opposite direction.
